Regulation 24 – Statement of the Representation Procedure of the Proposed Modifications
Publication Havant Borough Local Plan (Allocations) and accompanying Sustainability
Appraisal**

As part of the Local Plan process, Havant Borough Council plans to submit Proposed Modifications to the Local Plan (Allocations) and accompanying Sustainability Appraisal (SA) to the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government. The Proposed Modifications and SA are being published for public representations mainly relating to matters of soundness.

Document Title: Schedule of Changes (Additional Modifications) (V3) to the Havant Borough Local Plan (Allocations) Submission Version, April/May 2014 and accompanying Sustainability Appraisal, May 2014.

Subject Matter: The documents set out the proposed modifications to the document titled 'Havant Borough Local Plan (Allocations) Submission Version (including Policies Map) December 2013' and assesses its effects on sustainability

Area Covered: The Local Plan (Allocations) covers the whole of the Borough divided up into the five main areas of Emsworth, Havant and Bedhampton, Hayling Island, Leigh Park and Waterlooville

Publication Period: 12 May 2014 to 23 June 2014 at 23:59

Representations should focus on the grounds of soundness and legal compliance. Each point raised should be substantiated with regard to the following tests of soundness or matter of legal compliance as set out in National Planning Policy Framework – namely that it is:

- Positively prepared – the plan should be prepared based on a strategy which seeks to meet objectively assessed development and infrastructure requirements, including unmet requirements from neighbouring authorities where it is reasonable to do so and consistent with achieving sustainable development;
- Justified – the plan should be the most appropriate strategy, when considered against the reasonable alternatives, based on proportionate evidence;
- Effective – the plan should be deliverable over its period and based on effective joint working on cross-boundary strategic priorities; and
- Consistent with national policy – the plan should enable the delivery of sustainable development in accordance with the policies in the Framework.
