

Emsworth Neighbourhood Plan Referendum Information Statement

A Referendum on the Emsworth Neighbourhood Plan will be held on 8th July 2021.

The question which will be asked in the Referendum is:

“Do you want Havant Borough Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Emsworth to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?”

A person is entitled to vote in the Referendum if on 8th July 2021:

- They are entitled to vote in a local government election in the referendum area; and
- Their qualifying address for the election is in the referendum area.

A person's qualifying address is, in relation to a person registered in the register of electors, the address in respect of which he or she is entitled to be registered.

The Referendum area is identified on the map at the end of this statement. It is identical to the area which has previously been designated as the Emsworth Neighbourhood Area, which is also the Emsworth ward.

The Referendum will be conducted in accordance with procedures which are similar to those used at local government elections.

The Referendum expenses limit that will apply in relation to the Referendum is £2852.64. The number of persons entitled to vote in the Referendum by reference to which that limit has been calculated is 8316.

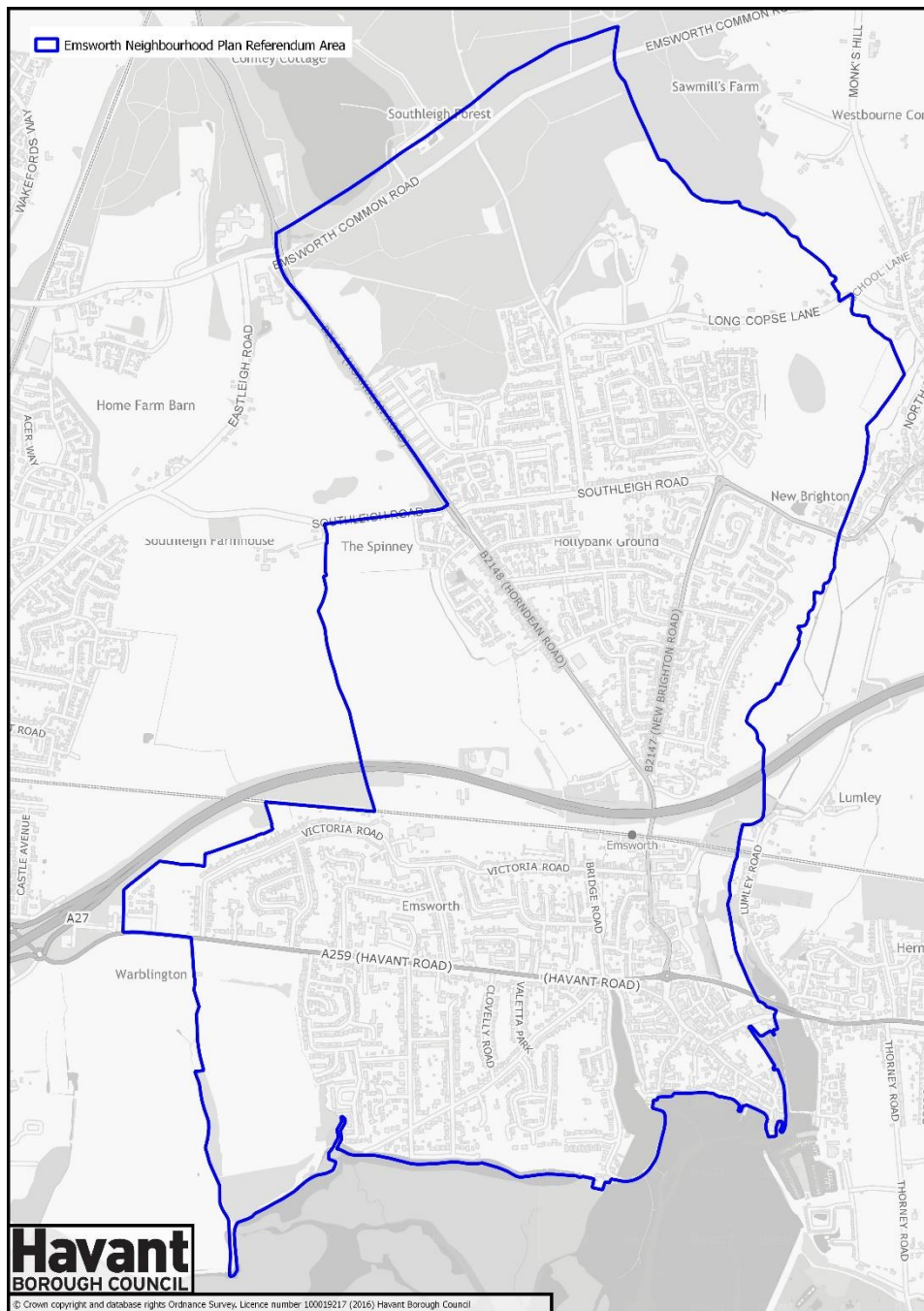
