TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING GENERAL DEVELOPMENT ORDER, 1950.

DIRECTION UNDER ARTICLE 4 - NO. 8

WHEREAS:

- (1) Article 3 of the Town and Country Planning General Development Order, 1950 (hereinafter called "the Order") permits development by the use of land (other than a building or the curtilage of a building or the site or curtilage of a building which has been demolished in consequence of war damage) for any purpose on not more than 28 days in total in any calendar year and the erection or placing of moveable structures on the land for the purposes of that use being Class IV.2 of the First Schedule to the Order
- (2) The uses of land specified in the First Schedule hereto are development within Class IV.2 of the Order
- (3) The Hampshire County Council (hereinafter called "the Council") are the Local Planning Authority for the land specified in the Second Schedule hereto (hereinafter called "the solid land")
- (4) The Council deem it expedient that the said development within Class IV.2 should not be carried out on the said land unless permission is granted on application made under the Order
- NOW THEREFORE the Council in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by
 Article 4 of the Order HEREBY DIRECT that the permission granted by Article
 3 of the said Order shall not apply to the development specified in the
 First Schedule hereto in respect of the land specified in the Second Schedule
 hereto

FIRST SCHEDULE

The use, except for the purposes of a travelling fair, of land as the site for caravans or for residential purposes otherwise than in tents and the erection or placing of moveable structures on the land for the purposes of those uses

SECOND SCHEDULE

Hayling Is land, within the Urban District of Havant and Waterloo, Hampshire, shown within a green line on the plan annexed hereto
