Is the development likely to have significant effects on the environment?

The application site is an existing household waste recycling centre facility located on Hayling Island. The proposal is for the installation of a CCTV security camera and associated equipment. The proposal does not include for any other changes to the existing permission for the site. The application lists under schedule 2 as it is within 100m of controlled waters, namely the boating lake which is designated as a Sites of Importance for Nature Conservation



(SINC). In turn, the boating lake empties into Chichester Harbour, which is a Sites of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI).

It is not considered that the proposed change would result in any additional impact on the environment by the site.

The proposed development is not an EIA development under the *Town & Country Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2011* as although within Schedule 2 and within 100m of controlled water, the overall level of activity and range of waste operations at the site remains similar and so the proposals are not likely to have significant environmental effects.
