

Guidance: What to do if you find an injured, distressed or dead animal

Birds (wild / garden variety)

What to do:

- If caught / injured by a cat, get in a box and take to the nearest vets.

Birds of Prey

What to do:

- Don't touch, especially babies. Call for advice first as the mum may be around, i.e. owls may have fallen from nest.
- If dead and on the side of a public highway, report using the Council's [online form](#).

Cats

What to do:

- If involved in a road traffic incident, get in a box and take to the nearest vets.
- If a stray cat, take to the nearest vets to have microchip scanned.
- If dead and on the side of a public highway, either take to the nearest vets or report using the Council's [online form](#).

Who you can contact for advice:

- Contact your local veterinary practice.

Deer

What to do:

- Don't touch babies, call for advice first. Mum may be around as babies get left during the day.
- If dead and blocking a public highway, call police on 101.
- If dead and on the side of a public highway, report using the Council's [online form](#).

- Police on 101 (only if dead and blocking a highway)

Foxes

What to do:

- Get in a box / basket and take to nearest vets. Advise them to use gloves and towels as foxes will bite.
- If dead and on the side of a public highway, report using the Council's [online form](#).

Hares

What to do:

- If caught / injured by a cat or dog, get in a box and take to the nearest vets.
- If dead and on the side of a public highway, report using the Council's [online form](#).
- If you find a baby hare alone, get in a box and take to the nearest vets. Babies are never left alone by their mothers.

Hedgehogs

What to do:

- Read the online advice first, as hedgehogs can be out in the day under certain circumstances, such as mums looking for extra food: [Found An Injured Hedgehog | RSPCA](#)
- If the online advice recommends taking the hedgehog to the vets, get in a cardboard box using gloves and take to the nearest vets.

Livestock

What to do:

- If alive/dead and blocking a public highway, call police on 101.
- If dead and on the side of a public highway, report using the Council's [online form](#) and Norse will be contracted to remove.
- If dead on private land (i.e. farmland), contact the landowner.

Seagulls

What to do:

- If there are multiple, dead birds, call DEFRA to report: 03000 200 301
- Is it one injured bird? Call RSCPA.

Seals

What to do:

- Keep your distance, do not attempt to interact with or move the animal.

Squirrels

What to do:

- If injured, get in a box and take to the nearest vets. Advise them to use gloves and towels as they may bite.

Swans

What to do:

- Keep your distance.
