In the last decade Havant Boroughhas seen a wide variety of changes that largely reflect the trends of the wider national population. More people are getting older and the more people are getting older and the average life expectancy is increasing while birth rates are only just increasing after a decade of decline.

### **IMPACT**

- **1. Housing:** 7-8% reduction in people owning a home with a mortgage still being paid in the past decade. 0.6% change in the number of people in social rented housing.
- **Religion:** 59.2% Christian, down from 73.5% in 2001 Those with no religion increased from 17.4% in 2001 to 32.3% in 2011.
- **3. Economic Activity:** 51% increase in unemployment since 2001, but only 4.0% of people seeking work unemployed. 9.2% reduction in long term sick or disabled.
- **4. Qualifications:** Only 25% of population have no qualifications, down from 31% in 2001. 48.8% increase in people with the highest qualifications, up to 22.3% of population.
- Industry: People employed in the construction industry were up 19%, but manufacturing jobs were down by 37%. People who are employed in education have increased 30% since 2001.
- **6. Ethnicity:** 4.8% of population is of an ethnicity other than White British, an increase of 56% compared to the figure of 3.06% in 2001.
- **7. Health & Care:** 8.8% of the population say that their daily activities are limited due to poor health or disability. 10.9% of all people provide unpaid care to sick or elderly relatives.
