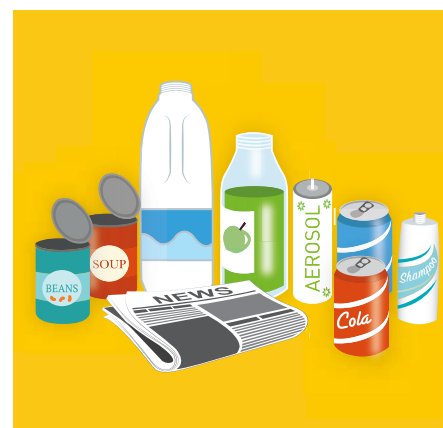

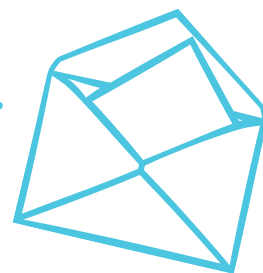

LOCAL COMMUNITY GROUPS ARE THE REAL WINNERS

The Havant Borough Community Lottery has been celebrating its first birthday by sharing thousands of pounds among local community groups.

Since its launch, more than 63,000 tickets have been sold raising a fantastic £37,812 for good causes in the borough – that's a total of 60% of every ticket going back to the community!

Fifty per cent of every ticket sold goes directly to groups who have registered, and players can choose which group or project they want to support. A further 10% goes into a community fund through which local groups can apply for small grants to support their work.

In celebration of this anniversary, the first round of grants has been awarded with more than £15,000 funding exciting projects which will support residents in the borough:

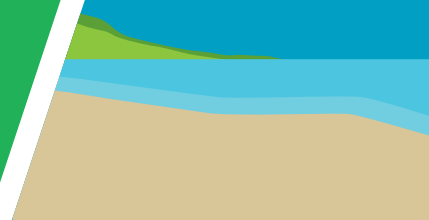

PLANNING FOR OUR FUTURE

You may have already read about the Havant Borough Local Plan 2036 in previous editions of Serving You and the local media.

This sets out opportunities for where homes and infrastructure could be built for future generations. It ensures that the development needed is delivered in the right places and is of the right character and quality. Making sure things like roads, schools and facilities for our communities are built.



The plan also identifies a new community at Southleigh providing up to 2,100 homes – and the provision of 82,780 square metres of employment floorspace supporting the expected rise in population during the lifetime of the plan.



An easy to read guide highlighting why this local plan is needed, and the consequences of not having it in place, has been produced. For more information visit www.havant.gov.uk/localplan

During the past three years we have been working to develop the Local Plan, listening to your comments along the way and making the changes that are needed.



Further public consultation took place earlier this year and we are now in the process of going through your comments. Later this year, the plan will be submitted to the Secretary of State for Housing, Communities and Local Government for a public examination.

An inspector will review the plan and the consultation comments to consider the 'soundness' of the Local Plan.



MAKE A BID FOR YOUR COMMUNITY

There's good news for residents interested in improving their area.

The Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL), funds received from planning contributions from developers, will be open to community groups from Friday 28 June. Bids can be submitted for a range of local projects that will benefit communities.

Neighbourhood groups and councillors can nominate their projects, or suggest schemes that they would like to see delivered in their area.

Community projects that have already benefitted include funds towards a replacement kitchen for Age UK and a new lobby at the Station Theatre, both on Hayling Island, improvements to accessibility at St Faith's Church, Havant, and studies to consider extending Hayling Sports Centre and the Acorn Centre in Wecock.

It has also been agreed that funds will go towards infrastructure projects including the Langstone 'Flood Protection' Scheme and Hayling 'Flood' Strategy, improvements to several pedestrian and cycle routes throughout the borough and studies to look into potential highway improvements including Warblington Interchange.

Those who want to nominate a project for CIL funding need to be prepared to match-fund it with 50% of the overall cost. Groups have until Friday 9 August to submit their bids.

WARDEN IT BE GOOD

Once known as traffic wardens who just gave out parking tickets, Havant Borough Council's Civil Enforcement Officers, or CEOs for short, are out on the streets and they're there to help you.

With new uniforms to help identify them, they aren't just about ensuring you're following the rules. They are first aid trained and dementia friendly - and the team of 12 have vast knowledge of the local areas. They are happy to help with directions, visitor enquires and in some cases, can even help with general queries about the council - and if they can't help you then and there they can point you in the right direction!

Although they are working more with a 'here to help' attitude their key objectives are still to reduce traffic congestion and to improve road safety by preventing unsafe parking - especially around schools.

Most of the parking restrictions in the borough apply to motorists 24/7 therefore the CEOs work on a shift basis to give the widest possible coverage. This is to ensure areas that have residential parking schemes are upheld, making it easy for residents to park near their homes.

Residents are very welcome to attend all our council meetings, which include our full council, scrutiny committee and development management committee meetings, where you can listen to the debate. 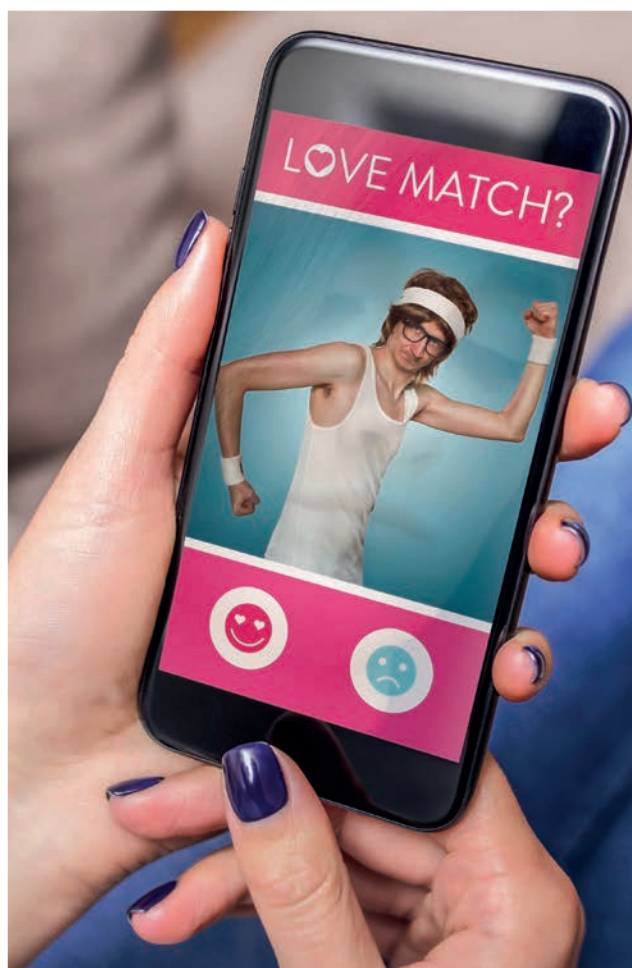

DON'T BE FACED WITH A £400 FINE

New legislation has now come into force to help tackle fly-tipping.

Two thirds of fly-tipping incidents involve household waste. This waste is usually not fly-tipped by the householder but by the person or company they have paid to take it away.

As the householder it is your legal responsibility to ensure the items you are disposing of are passed to a licensed waste carrier and to obtain a waste transfer note from them.

If you fail to do this and the waste is later found fly-tipped then you could get a Fixed Penalty Notice of £400.

IT'S TIME TO BIN BAD RECYCLING HABITS

Items should be clean and loose in your recycling bin:



It's not enough just to recycle.
It's important to recycle right.

Plastic bottles

All types e.g. milk, fruit juice, squash, mineral water, household cleaners, plastic cosmetic bottles such as shampoo, shower gel and detergent bottles. Please remove lids and empty and rinse all bottles.

Paper/cardboard

Newspapers, magazines, cardboard, catalogues, pamphlets, envelopes, other paper products and cardboard packaging can be included.

Cans

Food and drink cans, aerosols (without a skull and cross bones icon) - such as deodorants, hair sprays air fresheners and furniture polish - with the plastic lids removed

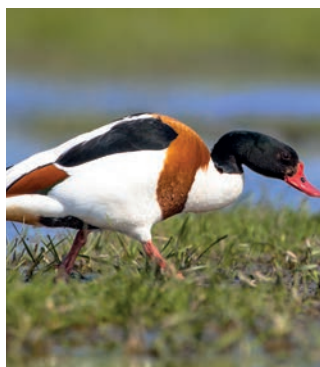

SOAR ACROSS THE SOLENT

During the summer we are joined by a group of coastal birds from the south – many from southern and western Africa. These birds travel to the Solent to breed and raise their chicks, exploiting fish shoals in our harbours.

These birds need our help as many species are struggling to survive. When you are out enjoying the coast, look out for birds and give them space to rest and feed.



Bird Aware Solent is a partnership of 14 local authorities, four nature conservation organisations and Hampshire County Council who are all working to reduce disturbance to our feathered friends. A team of rangers cover a 254km length of coastline, from Lymington to West Wittering, and on the northern shore of the Isle of Wight, from Colwell to Whitecliff Bay. The team spends the majority of its time on the coast highlighting the Solent's brilliant bird life and helping visitors avoid disturbing the birds.

To qualify for the Blue Flag award the area must provide first aid facilities, clean toilets, recycling facilities and there must be access for disabled visitors.

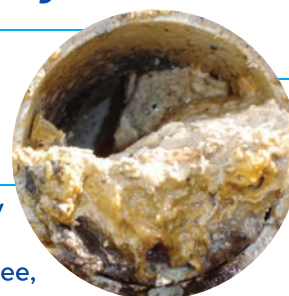
Water is also continuously tested during the summer season to check that it meets the strict bathing water quality standards.

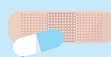

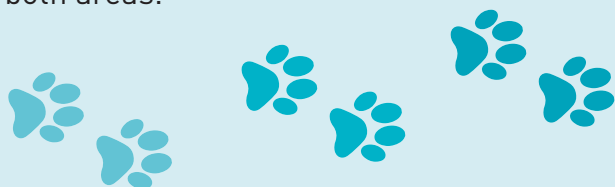
